### Who We Are

The YMCA is committed to youth development, healthy living and social responsibility. It is a privilege to provide a high quality preschool education, an enriching after school program and supportive youth development that meets the ever increasing needs of working parents.

### Philosophy

The CDC provides a loving, stimulating, learning environment where children and youth can discover, explore, experiment and grow at their own pace. Special emphasis is placed on helping each child and youth to develop social skills, nurture creativity, provide opportunities for learning and help build a positive self-image.



### Curriculum

Preschool curriculum is play-based and child-centered with a strong emphasis on developmentally appropriate practices. Each class has a schedule that includes large group, small group and individual activities offered in both indoor and outdoor settings that promotes and fosters learning in all academic trajectories including the implementation of STEM (science, technology, engineering, mathematics).



School Age and Middle School enrichment offers time each day for homework, creative art, outdoor games, sports, science and free choice. Special interest clubs, such as theater and cooking, are designed to fit the interests of the children.

High School opportunities include Youth & Government, Service Learning and Counselor-in-Training. Youth & Government teaches about the legislative and judicial process. The Service Learning program provides meaningful opportunities for high school students to earn community service hours required by local high school for graduation. Students can expand this experience with an individual plan to include job shadowing, resume building, interviewing and job search. The Counselor-in-Training program is a summer long leadership experience for high school students.



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### Snacks/Meals

Promoting good health and nutrition is an important foundation for a healthy life. We provide nutritious snacks and lunch, with a special emphasis on whole foods and fresh produce. Lunch is provided daily to children enrolled in our preschool program. All meals are served family style and align with the YMCA's Healthy Eating and Physical Activity Standards.



### Teachers/Counselors

Our goal is to hire the best quality people possible. They are selected based on their educational background, training, experience and sensitivity to the individual needs of children.
